

## Tennis Program

The 10-court, full-service Tennis Center is consistently recognized as one of the best facilities in the United States, and features lights for evening play and a dramatic stadium court. Services include match arrangements, instructional theme clinics, racquet and ball machine rentals, private and semi-private lessons. Recently ranked by Tennis Magazine as one of the Top 50 Resorts in America (#2 in Hawaii, #1 on Hawaii Island), the Tennis Center also hosts several tournaments and events throughout the year.

The tennis tournament will be directed by the USDTA tennis committee. NTRP ratings shall be used for rating and categorizing players. If there are any questions as to one's ability, either the facility pro or the USDTA tennis committee will rate the players (during the Sunday mixer). If there is a doubles team with the players having different ratings, then the highest rating of the two players shall be the team rating.

Dependents under 18 years of age or special guests shall not be allowed to play without special permission from the USDTA Board of Directors. Regular play shall be scheduled Monday through Friday. **Wednesday tennis will be optional, as it will be an open day.** Additional courts may be available for pick-up matches. Tentative format for the tennis program shall consist of singles, doubles and mixed doubles. The tournament committee reserves the right to change or modify the format to benefit the USDTA members. A, B and any other divisions will be decided by the tournament committee. The format will be determined on the number of entries.

To participate in the entire program consider arriving Saturday evening or early Sunday morning and departing on Saturday. Dentists will not be permitted on the tennis courts while the scientific programs are in session.

## About the Speakers



**Topic:** Functional Occlusion for the Natural Dentition and Oral Implantology

**Course Objective:** Review essential concepts of occlusion and to define how to improve longevity of restorative dentistry in natural teeth and dental implants.

**Dr. Philip Kroll, DDS, MS** graduated from USC in 1986 and immediately entered into private practice. Dr. Kroll has accumulated considerable post-graduate training including: Fellow of the Academy of General Dentistry, Master of the Academy of General Dentistry, Fellow of the American Academy of Implant dentistry. Most recently he was awarded the title of Honored Fellow to the American Academy of Implant Dentistry for his work on behalf of the Academy and for the promotion and betterment of oral implantology. In 2017 Dr. Kroll received his MS degree from USC, Herman Ostrow Scholl of Dentistry in Special Care Dentistry focusing on Geriatric Dentistry. His masters thesis was a Meta analysis on the value of dental implants for the geriatric patient. Dr. Kroll has been on faculty at UCLA for 12 years specifically, the UCLA Center for Esthetic Dentistry and serves as Course director of Occlusion for the two year post grad residency program. Dr. Kroll maintains a black belt in Tae Kwon Do and is an avid surfer, rough water swimmer, boater and scuba diver.



**Topic:** Contemporary Issues in Periodontics and Oral Implantology

**Course Objective:** To understand new concepts of microbiome; to be able to describe periodontitis and systemic diseases and to discuss the role of inflammation in periodontal diseases.

**Dr. Suzuki** received his D.D.S. from Loyola University of Chicago and Ph.D. in Microbiology from the Illinois Institute of Technology. He completed an N.I.H. Fellowship in Immunology at the University of Washington in Seattle, and a Clinical Certificate in Periodontics at the University of Maryland. His MBA with an emphasis on International Affairs is from the Katz Graduate School of Business of the University of Pittsburgh. Dr. Suzuki is a current panel member and immediate past-Chairman of the Food and Drug Administration Dental Products Panel, Silver Spring, MD. He is on the faculty of the US Navy National Naval Medical Command, Bethesda, MD, and also holds Professorships at Nova Southeastern University, Ft. Lauderdale, FL, the University of Maryland, and the University of Oklahoma. His honors include being named "Alumnus of the Year", Loyola University of Chicago, "Alumnus of the Year", Illinois Wesleyan University, "Recognized Alumnus in Biological Sciences", Illinois Institute of Technology, and "Faculty of the Year", University of Maryland. Dr. Suzuki won 1st place, Orban Prize Competition of the American Academy of Periodontology and won 1st place in the ADA/Dentsply SCADA Table Clinic Competition. He is in private practice limited to hospital periodontics in Philadelphia.



**Topic:** The Art of Diagnosing, and Precancerous Oral Lesions and Early Oral Cancer: Differential Diagnosis

**Course Objective:** Improve diagnostic skills of difficult oral conditions; to improve awareness/ recognition among dental health care providers of early cancer and precancerous oral lesions.

**Dr. Francina Lozada-Nur, DDS, MS, MPH**, is an emerita professor of oral medicine at the University of California at San Francisco (UCSF). She is a diplomate of oral medicine. Past director of the graduate program of oral medicine at UCSF, and Past President of the American Academy of Oral Medicine. She did her residency and training in OM at UCSF, graduate program in oral biology at UCSF, and Public Health (Epidemiology) at UCB. She was a professor in oral medicine at UCSF for 38 years. Most of her clinical research and vast publications were in the pathogenesis, clinical findings and management of oral vesiculo bullous diseases, early oral markets or HIV infection, early cancer, and diagnosis of oral mucosal diseases. Dr. Lozada Nur has lecture extensively nationally and internationally on the above mentioned areas.
